## FISHING AT LOWER MILL ESTATE: OWNERS & GUESTS



These rules apply to anybody who is fishing at Lower Mill Estate and, if you are challenged at any time, please be ready to explain who you are and which property you are staying at. Any members of LME staff must carry their fishing permits and LME Angling Club members should be able to provide evidence of their membership.

We do not intensively stock these lakes and there are very few swims. Lower Mill Estate is primarily a nature reserve and is not managed as a commercial fishery We ask all anglers to observe the Estate Rules and respect our protected wildlife habitat, being careful to remove any discarded lines, hooks, bait, litter etc.

- 1. A valid rod license is required and must be carried at all times when fishing on a lake at LME. This is available from the Post Office or can be purchased online at <a href="https://www.environment-agency.gov.uk">www.environment-agency.gov.uk</a>
- 2. Any person fishing at Lower Mill Estate must observe the stated Closed Seasons, as per the table below
- 3. Under no circumstances should any fish be removed or introduced to any lake, nor moved between lakes, without the permission of the Estate Manager. All fishing is catch-&-release, other than rod-caught trout from Flagham Fen and Spinney Lake
- 4. Live baits for pike fishing may not be used
- 5. Lure fishing is only allowed on LME lakes between 1st October and 14th March.
- 6. Unhooking mats MUST be used by all carp and pike anglers
- 7. No fires or loud radios allowed at the fishing site.
- 8. Angler's camps may not be left unattended at any time. Likewise, rods with lines out are not to be left unattended
- 9. No powered watercraft are allowed on the lakes, including electric ones. The only exception is Lower Mill Estate staff who are conducting essential works
- 10. Homeowners, their rental guests and LME staff may fish the lakes of Lower Mill Estate, subject to the Rules of the Estate. Please note that there is a 3-rod maximum.
  - The only members of the general public permitted to fish here are subscribed members of the Lower Mill Estate Angling Club; current members may fish Mill Lake and Farmhouse Lake ONLY. The Lower Mill Estate reserves all rights about the operation of the Angling Club.
  - No other person may fish the LME waters, even if they work on the Estate as a contractor or for any other third-party organisation/rental agent/etc.
- 11. LME carries a strict publicity ban with respect to fishing activities, to ensure the ongoing security of the fish. This means NO social media or press coverage of catches, or articles about fishing at any of the lakes.
- 12. Fishing rights will be suspended for anyone whose fishing activity brings the Lower Mill Estate into disrepute, or who fails to follow the Estate Rules. This is at the discretion of the Estate Manager. All anglers are requested to act as bailiffs whilst on the Estate and report any inappropriate activity
- 13. The Lower Mill Estate accepts no responsibility for loss or injury to any person or property whilst on the Estate. Life-saving flotation devices are placed throughout the Estate but you are responsible for your own safety. Lower Mill Estate accepts no responsibility for loss or injury to any person or property whilst on the premises.
